Open section	<p>1. Welcome and apologies - apologies were received from Amjid Iqbal, Lynn Rees, Scot Taylor and Diane Walker</p> <p>2. Declarations of interest - there were no declarations of interest</p> <p>3. CPDO report (MD) - update on training from MD. Meetings at CCG and PH around health & wellbeing. Meeting with Diane Burrows, commissioner in PH. Mental health promotion- 'Reach Out'. List of updated HLP's given to PH. Meeting at W.M. Pensioners Association coming up and attending on behalf of DLPC. Self-care at Dudley College also coming up and will attend. Discussion on Pharmacy2U and their tactics to sign up.</p> <p>4. Medicines management/Office of Public Health report (JS) - NHS long-term plan- primary care team looking at Primary Care Networks (PCN's)- aligned to five localities. Currently mapping on how that would look. Additional funding for pharmacists being employed by PCN's. Need strategic leadership for pharmacist recruitment. Funding will go to networks and not CCG/PH. PCN- looked on as strategic, with ICT as operational. 'Social prescribing'- connected to 'Thrive to Work'. Try to integrate individual into society. Clinical pharmacists- lead by Locality-lead pharmacists. Not sure how this will impact CP. Palliative care to be recommissioned, minor ailments to carry on. May need to review formulary. Boots and Lloyds still not on board. MECS will continue. High-Impact intervention project with Pharmacist Defense Association (PDA)- possible blood pressure/AF, trimethoprim/nitrofurantoin, AKI, inhaler technique being looked at</p> <p>5. Committee meetings</p> <p>a. Area Clinical Effectiveness committee - there was no ACE meeting attended</p> <p>b. Prescribing sub-committee - next meeting on Tuesday</p> <p>c. Primary Care Development committee - Waterfront- removal of one partner in May. Wollaston branch of 3 Villages closing on April 12th. Keelinge House and Bath Street surgeries- both rated good overall. Worries on shortages and supply chain. Next meeting Friday (TT)</p>

- telephone updates going well, more efficient. New surgeries due to join- Coseley, Stourside, Limes, Stafford St., and Cross St. Some faxes failing- contractors to avoid Mondays. Some pharmacies still have issues with forms. Will support eRD patients if surgeries get on board. Messages on tokens for pregabalin/gabapentin being issued. May need to look at secure e-mail sending of documents when faxes withdrawn. Currently a 6.4% reduction in item numbers, with a 2.7% reduction in costs.
