5. LSO update (JR)

Winter Wellbeing Booklets:- running short, will order more.

- Continuation of delivery ongoing.
- Catching up on current services during visits.
- Offering support and literature for promotion.
- High interest in the new Contraception and Common Conditions services.

Smoking Service:

- Stepping Stones: Pharmacist read training but didn't pass assessments. Will try again.
- Priory: Completed smoking training, ready to receive patients.
- Russell's Hall: Two staff members trained with C.Card, Chlamydia service picking up.
- County Pharmacy: Cathy completed smoking training, first referral for a 'Pre-op' patient.
- Milan: One training module remaining before readiness.
- Evergreen: Almost completed all training.

Emergency Hormonal Contraception (EHC):

- Stable demand currently; expecting an increase during Christmas/New Year.
- Enquiries made to ensure sufficient condom supplies for the party season.

Healthy Start Vitamins:

Operational at two new stores; progress expected.

Measles Awareness Posters:

- Ordered and delivered to interested pharmacies.
- Supporting pharmacies on the topic of measles awareness. Great posters to say 'ring ahead'. Instead of going to surgery. Visual posters excellent.





6. PISO update (RS)

Discharge Medicines Service:

- Attend monthly meetings with RHH team.
- Monitor pharmacies with more than 2 unactioned referrals.
- Contacted pharmacies with high unactioned referrals in November.
- 65% completion rate for claims via MYS in June and July. Gone up from 35% earlier in year.

Hypertension Case Finding Service:

- Relaunched on 1st December as part of NHS PCARP.
- Non-registered pharmacy staff can now be trained.
- Focus on increasing ABPM numbers.
- Registered for CPE webinar on 3/1/24 for updates.

Oral Contraception Service:

- Relaunched on 1st December as part of NHS PCARP.
- Pharmacies registered from that date must provide both supply and initiation.
- Grace period for existing pharmacies until 24th February 2024.
- Funding details: £900, with various milestones.

Pharmacy First Service:

- Launch on 31st January 2024 (subject to IT readiness).
- Covers 7 conditions; pharmacies expected to provide all services.
- £2000 sign-up fee, followed by monthly payments and consultation fees.
- Draft PGDs and protocol to be reviewed; training required.

GP-CPCS:

- Subsumed into the Pharmacy First Service after 31/1/24.
- Patients can self-refer for seven conditions.
- Pharmacists assess and treat based on PGD or existing Minor Ailment Service.
- JR Can tier 1 and 2 continue if not doing CCS? SN stated no answer to that yet. We do not know what midlands will do. We also don't know about our local PF.
- SN phasing out of extended care as PF takes off likely.
- Al stated that a good idea to ask contractors to put questions on WhatsApp group.

Action Points

- JR and Richard need more information for PF service.
- Encourage contractors to book on to webinars.

7. Chief Officer update (SN)

Christmas & New Year Opening:

- Prepared updated lists from NHSE for publishing.
- Produced pharmacy door poster lists and sent via WhatsApp and newsletter.
- Updated website and shared resources with other Chief Officers and ICB

NHS winter pressures:

- Parliamentary drop-in session on December 5th; wrote to two Dudley MPs.
- Believe that neither MP attended parliamentary session.
- Also publicised 'Don't Leave Your Health on the Shelf This Christmas' from November 27th.
 to December 1st.
- Gulshan Radio Interview Winter Promotion: asked by ICB to be interviewed on local Wolverhampton radio on December 4th; three key messages for listeners- pharmacists are medicines experts and are open over the Holiday period, pharmacies offer OTC services such

as the local Pharmacy First scheme, think ahead on ordering regular prescriptions and having a 'medicines cabinet' of basics for the holiday. Supported Cymran at Wren's Nest Pharmacy with Pharmacy Contraceptive Service for ITV News Pharmacy First: Concerned over lack of training opportunity for ENT part of service. • Talking to CPPE/CHS over possibility of putting on extra sessions, possibly Feb. '24 • Cost from CPPE likely to be around £1.9k plus cost of venue for 2x60 training places. 240 places not including Boots, who have their own training.
